Flynn Center for Irish Studies at the University of St. Thomas, the Houston-based traditional Irish band Hup!, and the Houston School of Irish Music, a free public concert called "An Irish Christmas" was held on Sunday, December 8, at Jones Hall on the UST campus.

Mathew Lewis, Larry Mallett, and
Robert Shaddox. Featured guest
artists were Erica Braverman
(sean nós dance) and Therese
Honey (harp). Four members of
Hup! happen also to teach at the
Houston School of Irish Music.
They arranged for the 16-piece
HOISM School Band to open the
second half of the show, giving
the school's students a chance to
shine for an audience.

The Flynn Center has been working with the Houston School of Irish Music since 2012 by providing classrooms on campus on a weekly basis. In 2019 the William J Flynn Center collaborated with Gulf Coast Cruinniú to secure on-campus facilities.

John Doyle
One would be hard-pressed to find a more influential guitarist in the Irish music world than John Doyle.
His collaborations with other musicians read like a Who's Who of the Irish trad world's greatest: Liz Carroll, Eileen Ivers, Karan Casey, Solas, John McCusker, Michael

McGoldrick, Nuala Kennedy and Eamon O'Leary, Martin Hayes, Kevin Crawford, Andy Irvine, Paddy Glackin and Donald Lunny among many others. As a founding member of the highly influential band Solas, John provided a strong and rhythmic foundation to the music. Scores of aspiring guitarists sought to emulate his style.

John has also worked broadly across other genres, performing with great musicians from the bluegrass world and with singer-songwriters worldwide. He has appeared on and produced countless albums as well as a number of solo albums. These feature his brilliant songwriting and singing, his guitar fireworks, as well as his creative and sensitive song accompaniments.

This will be John's fourth Cruinniú. He's a strong instructor who pushes students to work hard. He also adds an incalculable presence to our Saturday night concert. This year, we'll have the thrill of seeing him perform with his friend and longtime collaborator, Michael McGoldrick. John will teach in dropped D tuning. This will be a fantastic opportunity to study with the best.



This will be Caitlin
Warbelow's third year on
faculty with the Gulf Coast
Cruinniú. She is a New York
based violinist and entrepreneur originally from Alaska.
She served for seven years
as violinist/fiddler in the
original Broadway cast of the
Tony award-winning and
Grammy-nominated

musical Come From Away, and leads the Irish traditional ensemble Warbelow Range. Her live album of Irish traditional music in Manhattan pubs, Manhattan Island Sessions was nominated for an Independent Music Award in 2011. Caitlin has collaborated with many renowned Irish musicians and ensembles, including Cherish the Ladies, Green Fields of America with Mick Maloney, the Alt, and the Cathy Ryan Band, among others.

Caitlin is an All-Ireland winner and New England Fiddle Champion who holds degrees from Columbia University in anthropology and music. She is an experienced instructor of Irish fiddle as a faculty member of the Manhattan *Irish Arts Center*, the Swannanoa Gathering, the *Acadia Festival of Traditional Music & Dance*, and the Far North Fiddle Fest. She also maintains a private teaching studio in Manhattan and performs and tours as a solo artist with numerous ensembles and as a symphony soloist.

Caitlin is co-founder of Tune Supply, which was founded at the start of the Covid pandemic to help support musicians during that very difficult time. Tune Supply continues to offer online classes and resources for the Irish trad community.


