Attractions Near the UST Campus ... by Laura Michaelides

This is the second of two articles about attractions in Houston close to the University of St. Thomas. If you have a bit of spare time, the University is right in the heart of a culturally dynamic area with many rewarding cultural opportunities.

Walking Distance from Campus

Menil Foundation, as well as the Rothko Chapel. For those who appreciate art, the Menil is an important destination. John and Dominique de Menil were art patrons and philanthropists who founded the foundation in 1954. In 1987 the main museum opened, in a gorgeous building designed by the renowned architect Renzo Piano. The Museum now includes the Main Building, the Drawing Institute, the Cy Twombly Gallery, the Dan Flavin Installation at Richmond Hall, and the Fresco Building. Surrounding the campus is a public park area that is both welcoming and lushly green.

Art lovers from all over the world seek out the Menil, as well as the **Rothko Chapel**, which is a stone's throw away from campus. This is a non-denominational contemplative octagonal space, which holds murals by the artist Mark Rothko. The building was designed by Philip Johnson, Howard Barnstone, and Eugene Aubry.

At the north end of the University's campus, adjacent to the Cruinniu events, lies the **Chapel of St. Basil**. If you want to step out for a few minutes during the weekend, step into this beautiful and quiet space for a few minutes of downtime. Both the University campus and the chapel were designed by the famed modern architect, Philip Johnson.





A Longer Walk from Campus

Walk fifteen minutes away from the University, and you are in the heart of Houston's Museum District. The sprawling campus of **Houston Museum of Fine Arts** includes the **Cullen Sculpture Garden**, the Caroline Wiess Law Building, the Beck Building, the Kinder Building, a cafe and a restaurant. Here you'll find permanent exhibits of art from around the world as well as important traveling exhibits. Don't miss the passage between the main building and the Beck building, the James Turrell tunnel, which is quite thrilling.

Nearby is Houston's **Museum of Natural Science** comprising 433,000 square feet devoted to fantastic exhibits which study everything from dinosaurs, butterflies at the Cockrell Butterfly exhibit, the skies and stars at the Burke Baker Planetarium, gems, the human body, and lots, lots more.

Also in this area is the Houston Holocaust Museum, Houston Museum of African American Culture, the Buffalo Soldiers Museum, the Museum of Contemporary Arts Houston, the Asia Society, the Center for Contemporary Craft, the Houston Zoo, and Hermann Park.


As you can, see there is a lot to do and see. Take an extra day or two and explore some of what Houston has to offer.




