
University of St. Thomas (UST) Layout

UST Parking


Hall








Classroom Access








Flying In?

Saturday Irish Journeys

A. Sean-nós Style Singing – Robert Shaddox

Want to increase your emotional impact when you are singing? Would like to have your audience follow along on the emotional journey of your favorite Irish ballad? Learn the techniques, strategies and methods utilized by these traditional singers to carry the listener along to feel the ebbs and flows of the emotions the singer feels. Traditional Sean-nós is sung in Gaelic, singers who speak or plan to learn Gaelic songs can incorporate these techniques for greater impact. These methods can be utilized for both English and Gaelic traditional singers giving you more confidence in your singing and more enjoyment to your listeners.

B. Why Study Slow Airs? A Journey through Time – Jim Aman

Slow airs are an area of Irish trad often largely overlooked by players of melody instruments. Beautiful? Yes. Simple? Looks that way. Aren't they just for singers? No. Aren't they just songs without words? Sometimes. So why spend serious time working on them? And why dive headlong into them? What's the payoff? My journey in this corner of our musical world has been a personal revelation, a self-discovery, a cultural awakening, and the doorway to a special mission in the trad world. During our time together, we will look at this intriguing genre and what it really holds for its practitioners.
